Make a List of All Debts



Be diligent to know the state of your locks, and attend to your herds. - Prov. 27:23

Step #1



List the Lender, Balance, Interest Rate and Monthly Minimum

Debt	Balance	Interest Rate %	Minimum monthly Repayment
Store Card	\$ 2,000.00	24.5	\$ 63.00
Credit Card 1	\$ 1,340.00	18.6	\$ 33.00
Credit Card 2	\$ 7,600.00	16.5	\$ 195.00
Car Loan	\$12,800.00	14.23	\$ 320.00
Personal Loan	\$ 4,300.00	13.05	\$ 100.00
Total	\$28,040.00		\$ 711.00

Step #2



Calculate the Total of All Minimum Payments Due



Pay at least this amount until all debt is paid in full.

Step #3



The Debt Snowball is Effective



Like any wet snowball, the debt snowball increases in power and size as it rolls.

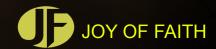


Application

- Order your debts from lowest balance to highest.
- Pay the minimum payment on all debts except the one with the lowest balance.
- Throw every penny at the debt with the lowest balance.
- When that debt is gone, do not alter the monthly amount used to pay debts, but throw all you can at the debt with the next-lowest balance.
